I would advise you that QCAT does not respond to complaints unless they lodged in accordance with our complaint policies. Complaints published on a website will not be actioned. Details of our complaint process can be found at <u>www.qcat.qld.gov.au/about-qcat/complaints</u>.

Please note, the way a member or adjudicator (decision-maker) conducts hearings and the decisions they make are solely within the jurisdiction of the presiding Tribunal decision maker. This includes the nature and extent of the material and evidence considered and relied upon to make a determination. These are decisions made by the Tribunal decision-maker in the exercise of their independent judicial function. Neither I, the Attorney-General nor any other Departmental officer can intervene or direct the Tribunal in these matters.

I understand your ongoing concerns but must advise I cannot assist you further. Future correspondence on these issues will not receive a response unless it raises significant new issues warranting attention.
